Given the shortage of child & adolescent psychiatrists in Florida, children with behavioral health issues are increasingly treated in the primary care environment. Additionally, the current coronavirus crisis is changing how care is delivered, compelling many providers to re-evaluate the use of virtual care. As a result, providers are being required to adapt and consider new partnerships, collaborations and methods of communication.

He is the Founding Chair of the Department of Psychiatry & Behavioral Health and Professor of Psychiatry & Pediatrics at the FIU Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine. Dr Castellanos also serves as the College of Medicine’s Assistant Dean for Graduate Medication Education and is the Associate Program Director of the Citrus Health Network-FIU Child & Adolescent Psychiatry Fellowship Training Program. His department has launched telehealth services serving residents across South Florida and he provides direct clinical care via telehealth to children, adolescents and young adults.
